Horse Identification Numbers:

Just a reminder that this new ruling for USDF is effective Oct. 1st

USAE requirements:

Horse identification numbers will be required for all horses competing in USAE and USDF competitions. There will be no charge for horse ID numbers that are issued via the internet to members of USA Equestrian or its affiliates for : 1) horses that are also Annual and life recorded, registered or otherwise identified or listed with a USA Equestrian discipline affiliate, or 2) horses registered with a USA Equestrian breed affiliate. Horses not meeting the above criteria must have a complete identification certificate submitted with the application for a horse ID number before a number will be issued. Horse ID numbers issued via mail will be charged \$10. Horse ID numbers issued at a competition will be charged \$20.

Fees or penalties for hard copy application have been waived until Dec. 1, 2003.

Ruth Arvanette Memorial Fund Application

USDF will award three grants for the 2002 USDF Annual Convention to be held Dec. 11-15, 2002 in Portland, Oregon. The grants will include reimbursement of up to \$500 for airfare, ½ of the lodging expense (5 nights

maximum) and a complementary full registration (awards banquet and benefit dinner not included). Total outlay per grant would be at most \$700.

Reimbursement of funds will occur after the convention. The application must be submitted no later than Sept. 30th. Please contact me if you would like a copy of the application.
